■ **LUCKY** members of Surrey Sculpture Society are exhibiting their work until August 12 in the idyllic setting of the walled garden at Loseley House, near Guildford.

More than 50 sculptors from across the South East are represented along a winding trail leading through garden "compartments", ranging from formal rose beds to a moat walk and vibrant flame-coloured or cool white plantings.

Big bold animal sculptures or abstracts are shown to good advantage in the exhibition. A dramatic cluster of tall hairy-trunked palms provide the ideal spot for Carlos Dare's black and powerful sheet-metal panther nuzzling his smaller colour-sprayed fox.

Commanding the skyline of the raised moat walk is Nikki Taylor's equally theatrical glittering life-sized silver stag in aluminium mesh.

The bold "statement" sculptures are in the minority and some of the

smaller pieces are in danger of disappearing into the vegetation, but within the more formal surroundings of the rose beds even the most compact figurative work well.

Paddy Burrows' large bronze resin *Jonah*, a sensitively sculpted study of a young boy with a bird balancing on each hand, stands out on all counts, while John Price's small and muscular bronze resin gladiator positioned at eye-level on a tall plinth is also notable.

Sheltering under a bush rose is Averil Marks' offbeat creamy stone resin sculpture of a woman dressing, and also notable is Kathy Shadwell's elongated ceramic tribal woman studded with decorated pottery fragments.

Striking a blow for the unexpected is Lendon Scantlebury, whose vigorously worked monumental sculpture of a semi-abstract female torso in green jessmonite flows up and over the central rose bed.

The walled garden exhibition is open Tuesday to Sunday 11am to 5pm. Loseley admission charges apply: £4 (adult), £3.50 (concessions) and £2 (child).
